# Harborview Medical Center and Path with Art unveil collaborative mural project

**WHAT:** The general public is invited to join Harborview Medical Center and

Path with Art to celebrate the completion of their summer-long, collaborative mural project for View Park, across the street from Harborview Medical Center. The project was led by local artist Kristen Ramirez. Attendees will have the chance to meet and speak with two participants, a Harborview patient and a frequent Path with Art student, who worked on the murals. Johnese Spisso, chief health system officer for UW Medicine and vice president of Medical Affairs for UW, will be providing the welcome. Holly Jacobson, executive director for Path with Art, and Peggy Weiss, director of Harborview's Art Program, will also be in attendance.

**Participant interviews:** We are happy to arrange time for interviews with Path with Art student Janine Boyer and Harborview Medical Center patient Enrique Martinez before or after the event.

In 2008, **Janine Boyer** was an accomplished architectural draftswoman and professor at South Seattle Community College. Then, she had what she calls an "episode" of schizophrenia that led to her 6-week hospitalization at Harborview and later led her to the YWCA, where she learned of Path with Art. Since 2010, Janine has been taking art classes as a way of dealing with her illness, and can now add painting and helping design the View Park mural to her list of accomplishments. She said that participating in art projects makes her feel less vulnerable to her illness and helps her meet other people.

Another participant is **Enrique Martinez**, a Harborview patient who was in a car accident and is currently in a wheelchair, working to regain use of his legs. Regarding the impact the mural has had on his life, he said it frees his mind from dwelling on the accident. Although Enrique's life took a dramatic turn, art and collaboration help him recover.

Interviews can also be arranged with **Kristen Ramirez**, Path with Art teaching artist and leader of the mural project; **Holly Jacobson**, executive director for Path with Art; and **Peggy Weiss**, director of Harborview Medical Center's Art Program.
